

"Separating Fine Gold from Black Sands"

A video by the G.P.A.A. Transcribed by, Paul Nagy

We have seen another video and a demonstration by leff Mosteller and Allen Mershon on this method of gold clean-up. What makes presentation graphic is the richness of the material being processed. hardly It's typical but the quantity of gold fines is so great that it positively shows how the system works. The presenters got the sample from beach sands at Nome, Alaska an area notorious for very fine gold. In the top few inches of the sluice the captured gold looks as if it had been painted on!

a three or four foot section of plastic roof gutter. The bottom liner is the plastic mesh which is sold to cover the top of the gutter so that it doesn't get clogged with leaves. Instead of resting on top of the gutter, it is pushed down into the bottom to form the floor of the sluice for gold winning. It's an easy set-up with no cutting or fitting of riffle material required. water flow is supplied by a battery operated pump or at home by a garden hose. In either case, the flow quantity is easily regulated for optimum performance. Likewise, the best angle of sluice is also determined by trial and error.

A good idea demonstrated in the video is the use of a bottle snifter during operation of the sluice. As the nearly pure gold is deposited in the sluice, it is quickly sucked up into the snifter. That prevents the gold from working its way down the sluice ultimately out into the reject. In this way, the operation is continuous without the need to stop for a cleanup. This is a real time saver. 




